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

Day 1 – Orbost to Buchan 59km

The four riders set off from Orbost in the rain, but we were all stoked to find that it would be the only time they needed their wet weather gear for the next five days. With the excitement of a remote adventure ahead, they powered through the scenic valley.

One of the highlights? The morning tea setup waiting for them along the road, with fresh banana bread provided by Flat Bickie. There's something special about arriving to a warm welcome with chairs set up for a break, and sharing stories while enjoying a cuppa. It's these little moments of connection that make our tours so personable.

As they cruised into Buchan, the stunning landscape kept everyone captivated. I had driven all day so decided to join them for a short, steep ride up the Buchan Road. To my surprise, they were all eager for even more climbing – they loved the challenge!







Day 2 – Buchan to Gelantipy 38km, +1,052 m / -406 m

After a cozy night on the hilltop at the Buchan Motel, the riders set off from Buchan just as the morning fog lifted, revealing the stunning scenery of the valley. I wasn't going to let them miss the breathtaking ride out of Buchan, so we timed our departure perfectly! The climb to Gelantipy awaited them, with winding roads and scenic views all around.

Morning tea was a well-deserved break, set up at the roadside as always, viewing the W Tree Falls. With koalas spotted in their natural habitat along the way, the riders couldn't stop marveling at the wildlife and how untouched this region is. We enjoyed a lovely lunch at Karoonda, where the bikes were recharged while we took a trip to Tulloch Ard Lookout. The real treat? Two mother koalas with babies on their backs—an absolutely unforgettable sight!

Karoonda Park welcomed us in the evening with an incredible five-course meal, showcasing true country hospitality. The day was filled with stunning landscapes, wildlife, and wonderful connections. This ride was already proving to be one **of the group's favorites!**





Day 3 – Gelantipy to Deddick, 52.6 kilometers · +876 m / -1,360 m

Blue skies greeted us as the riders set out from Gelantipy, ready for another day of incredible riding. Today, the adventure took them to the impressive Little River Falls, a hidden oasis perfect for a morning tea stop. The sense of discovery continued at Little River Gorge, which, despite its name, is anything but small! The group was awestruck by the sheer size and beauty of the gorge, a reminder of the vast and untamed country they were riding through.

The descent down to McKillops Bridge was an experience like no other. The winding, narrow road is much safer on a bike than in a car, and the riders felt the thrill of each twist and turn. At the bottom, a dip in the Snowy River was the perfect way to cool off and take in the peaceful surroundings.

The day ended with a relaxing stay at our homely accommodation near the Deddick River, where a swim was on the cards once again! With no reception or TV, we spent the evening playing cards —a true retreat into nature.






Day 4 – Deddick to Goongerah, 70.6 kilometers · +1,152 m / -1,136 m

Today's route featured contrasts, from gravel roads to lush green landscapes. The riders were undeterred by the challenging terrain as they made their way through the beautiful countryside.

The rain shadow area, known for its drier conditions, was surprisingly green—a rare sight for this region.

After a relaxed lunch at the Bonang Hall, the group hit the sealed Bonang Road, winding their way down through the ferns and Waratahs, into the natural oasis of Goongerah. Settled in this beautiful spot, we spent the evening playing cards, as kangaroos gathered around.

In the evening we enjoyed our beef stew and we were treated to a special visit from local Emily, who shared heartfelt stories about her Wombat Orphanage. The riders loved this personal touch, adding a deeper connection to the region and its incredible wildlife.





Day 5 – Goongerah to Orbost, 70.1 kilometers · +912 m / -1,165 m
